




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IN-PERSON AND ONLINE CLASS INFORMATION

We are happy to be able to offer both in-person and online classes. **Within our summer schedule all classes listed are offered in-person unless "online" is indicated.** Below is very important information that you will need to know when accessing our classes in-person or online.

In-Person Classes – You will receive information regarding materials, classroom location and parking location prior to the start of class. The college follows COVID protocols of classrooms being thoroughly cleaned, social distancing is practiced when available, and mask wearing indoors is strongly encouraged. All students must practice hand hygiene (washing and sanitizing) and refrain from attending class if feeling sick.

Also, to ensure that the health and safety of our community and in an ongoing effort to minimize the spread of COVID-19 and its variants, the Cerritos College Board of Directors have made, upon the recommendation of the CDC, and local and state government, improvements to Cerritos College COVID protocols (access complete protocol here: Cerritos Community College District BP2905). All participants, 12 years and over who attend any type of class on campus must be fully vaccinated. Full vaccination is considered to be two-shots of either Moderna or Pfizer, or one shot of Johnson and Johnson). Vaccination is strongly encouraged for students under 12 years old. Please consider this when registering for in-person classes.

All students, regardless of age, must follow the following steps when taking in-person classes.

Step 1. Required Health Screening

Before you arrive on campus, complete the health screening COVID-19 questions online within four (4) hours of your arrival.

Step 2. Clearance

Once approved, you will be cleared to come to campus.

Step 3. Mask Up

Surgical masks are recommended. Wear your face covering over your nose and mouth when you arrive to campus. Face coverings should be worn at all times inside campus facilities.

Step 4. Wristbands

Visit the Health Screening Kiosk to get your wristband. Wristbands must always be worn on campus (participants in the College for Youth program will visit the health screening area located in Lot 8, adults taking classes will visit the health Screening area in the Health Science Corridor).

Step 5. Report your Symptoms

If you are on campus, you are required to report to contact Community Education if you:

- Receive a positive COVID-19 test.
- Experience COVID-19-related symptoms.
- Been in close contact with someone who is COVID-19 positive.

SUMMER YOU'TH PROGRAM-HERE'S WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW...



Our kids/teens summer program is set up into three sessions. Each session is two weeks long and runs every weekday, Monday through Friday (excluding holidays).

Session #1: June 13th – June 24th (no class June 20th) Session #2: June 27th – July 8th (no class July 4th) Session #3: July 11th – July 22nd

Each session, classes begin every two hours (8am, 10am, 1pm & 3pm). You choose the dates that work for you, then choose the class(es) you want your child to take.... <u>it's up to you!</u>

- On pages 6-8, you will find our **Youth Schedule Planner**; this is our "cheat sheet" to help you easily see the main details about each session (dates, times, class titles). We also provide the age range for the class, as well as the page numbers as to where you can find the description details about each class.
- Your child is registered in a class upon payment for that class. If there is also a material fee listed for a class, this is paid directly to the teacher on the first day of class.
- Session #1 and Session #2 classes will not have class on Monday, June 20th and July 4th (holidays), so the registration fee is reduced, due to one less class meeting.
- Classes are filled on a first come, first served basis. If a class is full, you can put your child on the waiting list. If a spot opens up in that class, you will be contacted to see if you want to register your child at that time.

TEACHERS & STAFF

- Classes are taught by qualified teachers all academic courses are taught by college faculty, credentialed teachers and our enrichment courses are taught by instructors who have extensive experience in the subject being taught.
- There are student assistants helping in classes and during transition times and breaks.
- All teachers, student assistants and office staff working at Cerritos College have been fingerprinted and have a clean background check.

ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE

- Students should arrive 10-15 minutes prior to their class. You will first go to parking lot 8 to complete the daily health screening, you may then pull up and drop of your child at our pick up/drop-off area located in parking lot 9.
- Do not drop off your child prior to 7:45am there is no supervision before this time. Also, please make sure you pick up your child after their class(es) end; there is no supervision 15 minutes after the end of each class. **All children must be picked up by 5:00pm.**
- There is no fee for parking during the summer. Make sure you do not park in disabled spaces or you will be cited.

BREAKS & LUNCH

- Children are supervised during the 15-minute transition time before and after classes.
- If your child brings a snack, we ask that they eat it during the transition time between classes and not during class.
- Lunch break is from 11:45am 12:45pm; your child can bring a sack lunch or can bring money and buy food from our on-campus food vendor, located in our lunch area.
- Lunch break is supervised by our student assistants. There is no additional cost for this supervision; however, please register your child for this service so that we know how many kids will be staying with us over the lunch break.

SUPERVISION

- There is supervision of students 15 minutes before & after classes, during all class times as well as during breaks and lunch.
- Our student assistants will help with the drop-off / pick-up of your children (getting them in and out of your car safely), and assist them in lining up for their class. For their safety, please drop off only in the designated drop-off / pick-up area.
- Your child will be escorted to and from their classes by our student assistants and their teachers.
- For their safety, we require all students 12 or younger to be with one of our staff members or teachers; while on campus they are not allowed to be on their own at any time.

PROGRAM POLICIES

- In order to comply with campus safety policies, all teachers, staff and children over the age of 12 attending College for Youth must be fully vaccinated. This is considered to have received two shots of Moderna or Pfizer, or one shot of Johnson and Johnson.
- Only registered students are allowed in the classrooms no parents, other adults, or other kids who are not registered are not permitted in the class(es).



- Respect for self, others, materials and equipment will be expected. In the event that a student is not meeting our code of conduct, we will try and work out the situation with the student, so as to minimize any disturbance/disruption to anyone (the student, his/her classmates, and/or the teacher).
- If you need to cancel or transfer any class, we need three or more business days' notice prior to the start of the class(es). There will be a \$10 fee charged for any cancellations or transfers.

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STRATEGIES FOR STRENGTHENING READERS

GRADES 3-5

For many young readers, fluency can be a stumbling block, keeping them from greater reading comprehension. Through the use of guided reading, the teacher will work with your child in small groups as well as individually at their instructional level to guide them to using the context, visual, and structural cues within the story to generate meaning. These strategies are proven to be extremely useful for independent, fluent reading and decoding. This class will focus on changing your slower or even wordby-word reader into a more fluent reader who reads with greater understanding.

They will learn to read more closely to identify themes, social commentaries, and purposely chosen words that give what they are reading a new and more rich meaning.



MATH ESSENTIALS

GRADES 3-6

Once your child has mastered basic adding, subtracting and multiplication, there are other core skills that they will need to learn. This class will cover the other fundamentals such as complex multiplication, division, word problems, lowest common multiplier (LCM), greatest common factor (GCF), and lowest common denominator (LCD). 





MOTORCYCLIST TRAINING COURSE (MTC)



DMV CERTIFICATE AWARDED (upon successful course completion)

California Motorcyclist Safety Program offers the Motorcyclist Training Course (MTC), which is designed for the novice rider with no (or limited) street-riding



experience. This 16-hour weekend course includes both classroom and on-cycle instruction. Although designed for new riders, any rider that has not taken a motorcycle course will benefit from this course. You will learn fundamental skills required to operate the motorcycle and progress to street riding skills and strategies. Topics covered include: overcoming fear, understanding how motorcycles turn, proper cornering strategies, and emergency crash avoidance skills.

This course is mandatory for those under 21 years of age desiring a motorcycle or scooter license. For students under 18, a parent must show ID (or legal guardian or at the stort of the first algoe

proof of guardianship) and sign a waiver at the start of the first class.

You will have 6 hours of in-class instruction and 10 hours of on the range, riding instruction and practice. You must be on time to every part of this course - if you are late, you will be dismissed from the class. Please bring water, and a sack lunch, as you will be in your class all day and will not have enough time to leave campus to purchase food.

A motorcycle and helmet will be provided for you in this course; if you want to complete the course on a scooter, you must notify us upon registering for the class. You need to bring either a valid a state issued driver's license, permit or ID card to the first class. Additionally, you will need to be dressed in a long sleeve shirt or jacket, full-fingered street-motorcycle-specific or leather gloves (mechanics-style gloves, off-road gloves, etc. are NOT allowed), long, thick jeans or pants (no spandex/ stretch pants) without rips or holes and sturdy, padded, over the ankle boots (no fashion boots, or high heeled boots), leather high-top sneakers are allowed (canvas or cloth sneakers are NOT allowed).

In accordance with State safety standards, early dismissal may occur during the riding portion of the class if you do not demonstrate safe riding techniques (as determined by the instructor). Your attendance and participation is not a guarantee that you will be able to successfully complete the course. Students successfully completing the class will receive the DMV completion certificate, which may waive the riding portion of the DMV test. Your certificate will be mailed to you within 10 working days of your course completion. (Note: you will still need to take the written test at the DMV).
