SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAM INFORMATION

SUMMER YOU'TH PROGRAM-HERE'S WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW...



Our kids/teens summer program is set up into three sessions. Each session is two weeks long and runs every weekday, Monday through Friday (excluding holidays).

Session #1: June 26th – July 7th (no class July 4th) Session #2: July 10th – July 21st Session #3: July 24th – Aug 4th

Each session, classes begin every two hours (8am, 10am, 1pm & 3pm). You choose the dates that work for you, then choose the class(es) you want your child to take.... *it's up to you!*

ENROLLMENT

• Students Exposure to College: These icons below represent the Learning Career Pathways at Cerritos College. You will see them throughout our schedule as a way to immerse our youth in the Cerritos College Experience.

- On pages 8-10, you will find our **Youth Schedule Planner**; this is our "cheat sheet" to help you easily see the main details about each session (dates, times, class titles). We also provide the age range for the class, as well as the page numbers as to where you can find the description details about each class.
- Your child is registered in a class upon payment for that class.
- Session #1 classes will not have class on Tuesday, July 4th (holiday), the registration fee is reduced, due to one less class meeting.
- Classes are filled on a first come, first served basis. If a class is full, you can put your child on the waiting list. If a spot opens in that class, you will be contacted to see if you want to register your child at that time.

CHILD / TEEN CLASSES SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAM INFORMATION

TEACHERS & STAFF

- Classes are taught by qualified teachers all academic courses are taught by credentialed school teachers, teachers with college level teaching experience, or those who hold a Bachelor's degree or higher and our enrichment courses are taught by instructors who have extensive experience in the subject being taught.
- There are student assistants helping in classes and during transition times and breaks.
- All teachers, student assistants and office staff working at Cerritos College have been fingerprinted and have a clean background check.

ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE

- Students should arrive 10-15 minutes prior to their class. You may pull up and drop off your child at our pick-up/drop-off area (located in parking lot 9). In that lot, there will be staff as well as signs to guide you as to where to go and drop off your children.
- Do not drop off your child prior to 7:45am there is no supervision before this time. Also, please make sure you pick up your child after their class(es) end; there is no supervision 15 minutes after the end of each class.
- If you park on campus you will need a pass. You can purchase a daily pass for \$3 or a weekly or monthly pass. Please visit PayMyCite.com for more information.

FISH OUT OF WATER (Supervised fitness and fun after swim)

• If your child is enrolled in a swim class between 1pm-2:45pm and they have a 3pm College For Youth Class, they can participate in Fish Out of Water and our staff will walk them to their 3pm class. If they are taking a swim class between 2:55pm-4:00pm they can participate in Fish Out Of Water, but parents will have to pick them up.

BREAKS & LUNCH

- Children are supervised during the 15-minute transition time before and after classes.
- If your child brings a snack, we ask that they eat it during the transition time between classes and not during class.
- Lunch break is from 11:45am 12:45pm; your child must bring a sack lunch, there are no campus lunch options available.
- Lunch break is supervised by our student assistants. There is no additional cost for this supervision; however, please register your child for this service so that we know how many kids will be staying with us over the lunch break.

SUPERVISION

- There is supervision of students 15 minutes before & after classes, during all class times as well as during breaks and lunch.
- Our student assistants will help with the drop-off / pick-up of your children (getting them in and out of your car safely) and assist them in lining up for their class. For their safety, please drop off only in the designated drop-off / pick-up area
- Your child will be escorted to and from their classes by our student assistants and their teachers.



CHILD / TEEN CLASSES SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAM INFORMATION

• For their safety, we require all students 12 of younger to be with one of our staff members or teachers; while on campus they are not allowed to be on their own at any time.

PROGRAM POLICIES

- Only registered students are allowed in the classrooms no parents, other adults, or other kids who are not registered are not permitted in the class(es).
- Respect for self, others, materials, and equipment will be expected. In the event that a student is not meeting our code of conduct, we will try and work out the situation with the student to minimize any disturbance/disruption to anyone (the student, his/her classmates, and/or the teacher).
- If you need to cancel or transfer any class, we need three or more business days' notice prior to the start of the class(es). There will be a \$10 fee charged for any cancellations or transfers.

You must be on time to every part of this course – if you are late, you will be dismissed from the class. You need to bring either a valid a state issued driver's license, permit or ID card to the first class. In accordance with State safety standards, early dismissal may occur during the riding portion of the class if you do not demonstrate safe riding techniques (as determined by the instructor). Your attendance and participation is not a guarantee that you will be able to successfully complete the course. Students successfully completing the class will receive the DMV completion certificate, which may waive the riding portion of the DMV test. Your certificate will be mailed to you within 10 working days of your course completion. (Note: you will still need to take the written test at the DMV).

If you register and the out of state court rejects your completion receipt, no refund will be given.

Per DMV regulations, class begins at 8am sharp - you cannot arrive late. Please arrive approximately 15 minutes before class begins in order to buy your parking permit, find your class location on campus and fill out your paperwork you need to complete for your class. You need to be in your seat at the start of class - if you are late, you will not be let in, and no refund will be issued.

At the completion of class, you will receive a completion receipt. Within three business days, the office will enter your attendance and information you provided on the forms you completed into the CA DMV system electronically; this is how the courts will know that you completed your class. *Per DMV regulations, commercial drivers are prohibited from attending traffic school except if they obtain a violation when operating a non-commercial vehicle (per AB 1888).
